We appeal our alumni to provide there sincere feedback to us though mails and during alumni meet. Till now we have received feedback from total 70 alumni. We asked our students to give a special comment on the curriculum of the university. Based on the comments of the alumni, the analysis is done as follows:

The feedback report shows that 18% students feel that the curriculum designed by the university is good and require no change.

39% of alumni feel that there is need to add more practical approach in the curriculum.

5% students feel that there is need to add extracurricular activities and activities related to placements in the curricular.

20% students feel that there is need to add latest technology in the syllabus.

36% students did not comment anything on the curriculum.

FEEDBACK ANALYSIS OF STAKEHOLDERS AND ACTION TAKEN

The institution collects feedback on curriculum aspects and courses from different stakeholders such as students, alumni, faculty, employers, and external academicians. Institute has all stockholder feedback for continuous improvement of the system. The objective of this system is to provide a framework for acquiring, summarising and documenting information on all stockholder feedbacks. All the departments have practice of taking feedback from stockholders, namely, students through student exit survey, teachers through teachers feedback on curriculum, parents through parents teachers meet, alumni feedback through alumni meet etc. The collective feedback of all stackholders were summarised and analysed by each department.
