ALUMNI FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT

2018-2019

Our alumni feedback is valuable for us as it provides us the inputs regarding improvement in facilities and employability of our students. We appeal our alumni to provide there sincere feedback to us though mails and during alumni meet. Till now we have received feedback from total 49 alumni. We asked our students to give a special comment on the curriculum of the university. Based on the comments of the alumni, the analysis is done as follows:

The feedback report shows that 18% students feel that the curriculum designed by the university is good and require no change.

29% of alumni feel that there is need to add more practical approach in the curriculum.

5% students feel that there is need to add extracurricular activities and activities related to placements in the curricular.

13% students feel that there is need to add latest technology in the syllabus.

34% students did not comment anything on the curriculum.

Feedback from external stockholders on curriculum

We have received feedback from our major stakeholders such as industry person, external academician and employer regarding their views and suggestions on curriculam for enhancing the employability of our students. Their feedback is valuable for us as it provides the basis for further enrichment in curriculum aspects and overall performance of students.

We have received feedback from some of our stockholders. But no special comment was given on the curriculum. However, we did following analysis from the received feedback forms: In general the employers are happy with the student of our institute and they rated the performance of our students in the scale of 1-5.

The employers reported that they would like to employ more students from our institute.

The employers also reported that they would like to recommend our students to other organization.

The feedback suggested the need for more practical lab for coding algorithm and design pattern from industry perspective.

Teaching Staff Feedback Analysis Report

As per the practice adopted by the college to take feedback from the teachers of the institute every year on various criteria such as, curriculum design and development, teaching, learning, evaluation & research, infrastructure and governance. This year also we have taken feedback from almost all teachers for the session 2018-19 and analyzed. After the analysis, report was prepared and submitted to IQAC. The feedback rating was taken on a five point scale i.e., Excellent, Very good, Good, Average and below average. Rating for almost all the parameters fell in the range of "Excellent" to "Good". On an average 61% of the teachers feedback was excellent regarding the services of the college.





Parents Feedback Report

Objective of Feedback

As per the practice adopted by college to take feedback from the parents every year regarding admission procedure, various facilities, discipline, Teaching& learning, examination system, placement, office mechanism etc. in college. This year also the feedback for the session 2018-19 was collected from the Parents in Parents-Teacher Meeting and analyzed. After the analysis, report was prepared and submitted to IQAC.

Process Adopted for Feedback

In each academic session we asked parents to complete a printed feedback form (provided by college) to assess the satisfaction of parents regarding the services of the college. PTA Committee asks parents to complete a feedback form to gain an insight into how college could improve on various parameters. We value feedback and treat it with highest respect, courtesy, value and confidentiality. The feedback form is also available on the college website. Filling of feedback is voluntary.

Design of Feedback

The feedback collected included rating of key services on a five point scale: 1. Excellent 2. Very good 3. Good 4. Average 5. Below average

Areas assessed were

- 1. Admission preference amongst other colleges
- 2. Admission procedure
- 3. Security and discipline of college campus
- 4. Academic atmosphere
- 5. College infrastructure

Besides this, comments/opinions were also requested from the parents.

Analysis of Feedback

Feedback was sorted and the opinion obtained for each parameter is represented as percentage of total number of feedback response obtained for that parameter represented in parenthesis. Percentage overall average of rating was also computed for each academic session.

PTA FEEDBACK ANALYSIS & ACTION TAKEN REPORT: 2018-19

We have collected feedback from 53 parents during Parents' teachers' meet. Rating for almost all the parameters fell in the range of "Excellent" to "Good". On an average 44% of the parents' feedback were excellent regarding the services of the college, 39% felt it was very good and 16% felt as good. For the admission of their ward, it was parent's first preference (72%) for this college. Parents have given highest ranking, excellent for academic atmosphere (41%) of the college. They were also satisfied with the college infrastructure (40%), admission procedure (42%) and security and discipline of the college campus (43%) by rating very good.

Feedback Outcome

On analyzing the feedback received from the parents, it is observed that parents are largely satisfied by the efforts made by the college administration in admissions, teaching and learning, discipline and other related matters and high degree of satisfaction has been shown by the parents on implementations of some of the suggestions made by them. Parents rated opting for admission to this college very high on three grounds viz. location, teaching, security and discipline. Parents were also very satisfied by the security and overall discipline of the college by giving it very high rating. Highest rating was given to the academic atmosphere. There were numerous positive comments on teaching and teacher-student interaction and teachers were described as caring, cooperative, approachable and efficient.

Significant suggestions received from the parents:

- 1. Parents suggested having uniform for the students of the college.
- 2. Parents suggested having parking facility inside the campus.
- 3. Speedy resolving of student disputes.
- 4. Suggested to build boy's Hostel Facility
- 5. Parents Suggested having computer and net facility in Library.

Action Taken:


- 1. Discussion on implementation of college uniform was done in the PTA Executive in order to have more clarity, but couldn't arrive at a unanimous decision.

- 5. Computer and net facility has been made available for students after their regular lectures.





Student Feedback Analysis Report 2018-2019




